**My helpful (frugal) hints this month:**

Save your chop sticks from Chinese take-out food. Give the chopsticks a good scrub and rinse, use them for temporary plant stakes. Use a twisty tie from your store-bought bread bag. (Use better quality stakes and ties for plants going to a show!) If the paperboard take-out box has one of those little wire handles, remove it and use pliers to shape it into an S-hook for hanging mounted plants.

Got a sweet tooth? Save the thin foil wrappers from those bite-size milk chocolate kisses. They are handy for making a "slug guard." Gently fold the foil around the budding spike below the point where the petioles emerge from the sheath or leaf stalk. Slugs are loath to cross a metal material.
