Judith "Judy" Collison (nee Funk) (1942-2021)

Judy Collison, a mother, teacher, generous friend to every soul lucky enough to meet her, died on August 19, 2021, at age 79, after 40 years of marriage with her beloved husband George. The cause was congestive heart failure.

Born a Jewish girl to Jewish parents, in 1942 in Budapest, she faced a hazardous future. Her mother, Rose, left the infant Judith at Jewish Hospital that placed Judith in one of the 24 Wallenberg safe houses, which were organized by the Swiss ambassador, Raoul Wallenberg. As a means of protection, Wallenberg printed formal documents declaring all Jews citizens of Sweden. At age 2 she was one of only 4 children that survived a Nazi storm trouper attack on that house. She was scarred for life by 3 bullet wounds. She was found and nursed back to health by her Aunt Giselle. Judith lived with Giselle and Henry Benscath until 16. Rose, who attempted to escape by train, was captured and imprisoned at Auschwitz, survives Judith today. Her father was killed digging trenches for Nazis on the Russian front. Able bodied Jews were conscripted for this dangerous work.

At 16 Judith was flown to the USA by military transport, and met up with her mother. Judith later lived in New York and attended City College, where she met and married Harvey Feder, with whom she had three children, Dan, Steve and Amanda. After her divorce from a difficult marriage, she moved with her children to Amherst, MA, where she attained a doctorate in critical thinking at the University of Massachusetts. In 1981, she married a fellow doctoral student George Collison from Holyoke MA.

She attained a distinguished academic career, in mathematics education and critical thinking. She taught at University of Massachusetts, Westfield State University, Williams College, and Rutgers University, as well as working in various international settings.

In 1998, she and George adopted three orphans, Gregory, Evelyn, and Benjamin, from Eastern Hungary after the death of Judith's stepfather Henry Benscath, a world class graphic artist. She wanted to give back for the kindness he had shown her. Judith and George lost one of the adopted children, Evelyn, to the H1N1 virus at age 20.

Judith passed from this life peacefully completing a time here on earth with humility, grandeur, compassion, and righteousness on August 19, 2021 at 9:45 pm at Bay State Medical Center. She was attended by her husband, sons Daniel and Steven, and a family friend.

She brought wisdom and love to all who were most fortunate to meet her. We grieve and are all diminished by her passing.

Judy is survived by her husband George Collison of Amherst, Massachusetts; her mother Rose Friedland of Bal Harbour, Florida; brother Frank King of Israel, children Daniel Feder (Rachel Feder) of Ann Arbor, Michigan, Steve Feder (Amy Winston) of Edgecomb, Maine, Mandy Feder-Sawyer (Larry Sawyer) of Red Bluff, California, Greg Collison of Amherst, and Benjamin Collison of Northampton, Massachusetts; grandchildren Louise (Ross Keyes), Henry, and Lucas Feder, Josee

Winston-Feder, Nicole Hana (Kevin Hana), and Miranda Welle (Robert John Welle II); and great-grandchildren Howard Keyes, Eloise Hana, and Lorne Hana. Judy was predeceased by her daughter Evelyn Collison. She is also survived by "special" family members, Mike and Tanya Barrette and their children, Erich and Cynthia of Fort Pierce, Florida.

Judith was buried on September 11, 2021 at Wildwood Cemetery, Amherst, MA. The service and interment were private.
