# July 17 Meeting and Picnic at Roger's Home

These will be mostly fall and winter bloomers. All will have at least one new growth but most will have 2 or more new growths. Many are big plants, all in great shape. There are a few showing blooming sheaths. There will be a silent auction for 4 of the plants. The silent deal is you make a bid and put it into a sealed container and at the end, highest bid gets the plant. I did this so we can put in a \$5 bid and not be frowned upon. The 4 plants are as follows:

C. Nancy Off"Linwood" Am/AOS it has 2 new growths in sheath, a very large white and wins a blue every show it's in. A good size plant

Bc. Maikai "Grace" This was last seen at the last February meeting with tons of blooms. This is a nodosa hybrid that has a nodosa fragrance. Last counted there are 20 new growths. A part of this plant won best in show at a previous Nutmeg show. Again, a large plant but not too tall, it had light purple blooms that lighten with age.

Ric Hawaii Stars "Pink Lace" Another nodosa hybrid but a mini, blooms are white and pink. It has 8 new growths.

Lc Busy Bev "Blue Jewel". This is a so called "blue", it is as blue as it gets in the cattleya world It is a compact grower with 4 new growths. I have not shown this plant but if I did it would have been purchased by someone. I think it has a quality bloom.

I hope this silent stuff will add a little excitement to the meeting. I know I'm excited, this should be a fun time and if you can't make it have someone put in a bid for you. There is some great quality to these plants.


# FEDERALLY THREATENED ORCHID DISCOVERED IN VERMONT



Botanists with the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department confirmed that a population of small whorled pogonia—believed to be extinct in Vermont since 1902 and listed as threatened under the Federal Endangered Species Act—has been documented on Winooski Valley Park District conservation land in Chittenden County.

"Discovering a viable population of a federally threatened species unknown in our state for over a century is astounding," said Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department Botanist Bob Popp. "It's Vermont's equivalent of rediscovering the ivory-billed woodpecker."

The small whorled pogonia is a globally rare orchid historically found across the eastern states and Ontario. Previous searches for the species in Vermont have been unsuccessful. As with many orchids, little is understood about the species' habitat needs. Populations in Maine and New Hampshire are found in areas of partial sun including forest edges and openings.
