New York Botanical Garden Orchid Show


For those of you who have not yet had your fill of orchid shows, the New York Botanical Gardens are having their 20th annual orchid show until April 23rd. I went there, a few days after the end of our show. The show always features thousands of plants distributed throughout the 2-acre greenhouse About 75 percent of the plants are Phals There are numerous new patterns. They tend to be clustered with about a dozen plants in a cluster. Scattered throughout are some large specimen plants, probably from the collection of the garden. Many, but not all plants are labeled. There are a fair number of Paphs and Cymbidiums and an area of Bletias Only a few Vandas and oncidium hybrids. There are also permanent plants in the greenhouse, many of which are also in bloom including two giant vines, a Thunbergia species with panicles of red and yellow flowers, and a Jade Vine with panicles of turquoise flowers that was just coming into bloom. Tickets are expensive (\$35 plus parking) If the weather permits, be sure to visit the 2 acre rock garden and the native plant garden which is filled with Trilliums and Cypripediums. Arthur Avenue (where Little Italy has moved) is less than a mile away. If you can go during a week day, the crowds will be much less.




